Dear Parents,

A warm welcome back to you all, and it is a pleasure to write my first bulletin of the Christmas half term which is by far my favourite!

To begin, it is a pleasure to say that at a time of change and unrest what a wonderful couple of weeks we have had so far. Focusing on the positive, I would like to thank parents for supporting our school community in the Halloween events. This was a magical and fun event that brought us all together, whether it be as ghosts, dinosaurs, or princesses. The children and staff enjoyed this very much, but not quite nearly as much as the

parents judging from the many smiles that I saw in the playground at drop off and pick up.

As a means to focus on the positive rather than the negative, Gatehouse is embracing many more exciting events to encourage and motivate children, as the Gatehouse ethos of 'children develop their own uniqueness of personality, to enable them to appreciate the world and the world to appreciate them' is never far from my mind and very close to my heart.

We will also send out information with regard to House activities and events, including a day when children can dress up in their own clothes but in their House colours.

A further update is that I had arranged for Tempest Photographers to attend school on 10th November to photograph pupils. Due to the lockdown and uncertainty with regard to what will happen next, I have cancelled their visit and will instead have in-house photographs taken of the pupils which we will print off

and forward to parents as a Christmas present.

I am also pleased to note that we continue to work closely with Raines Foundation School, and following the lockdown update we will revert back to using their premises for afternoon Games sessions.

Adding another happy note to this bulletin, I am delighted to share with you that Ellie Mae Barnaby, who works in RS, is expecting her first child in the Spring Term. I am sure that like myself, you all wish Ms Barnaby well. With regard to any changes in staffing due to this news, I will update you when necessary.
