HEAD'S WELCOME

I want to begin by thanking you all for your continued support with regard to supporting us all at school by observing social distancing during drop-off and collection time. This support is appreciated with regard to ensuring that the bubbles are separated from each other. However, it is important that I share with you my concerns with regard to bubbles mixing for play-dates or travel arrangements. In these instances, it would be frustrating and almost soul-destroying for the school if all the hard work and precautionary measures were undone outside of school. More importantly, this would mean additional bubble closures due to external circumstances, something that I know none of us want. Therefore, I strongly urge all parents at this time, a time that has numerous schools

closing due to positive cases, to please continue to support the school both at school and away from school.

Taking temperatures every morning has been effective in ensuring that no-one comes into school unwell. As the weather is now turning colder, from the return after half-term, we will move to taking the temperatures once the children come inside the building. Nurse Freya will call any parent where there are concerns.

As a non-selective school we are proud to celebrate a range of interesting and diverse learning styles, and this week we celebrated Dyslexia Awareness Week with assemblies and classroom discussions to understand further what this means for pupils, and to also look at past and present role models who have all made invaluable contributions to society. Despite Covid, Gatehouse strives to continue to be as reliable and normal as possible under these circumstances. Therefore, I am pleased to announce that our annual Halloween Autumn Event will happen on Friday 30th October, albeit a little differently. All children can come to school dressed in a Halloween costume. We do ask this year that no additional costume props are brought into school, just clothing. This will be a 'Happy Halloween' event so we are kindly asking that no 'morbid', 'blood-curdling' or 'little child frightening' costumes are worn (Nursery and Reception are usually a little too young for this but we would like to include them this year in a softer and more gentle version

of Halloween). Lessons will take place as normal, but of course, in keeping with the theme they will based around Halloween.

In order to keep lines of communication strong at this tricky time, we have allocated a designated area on the website to hold all of the correspondence sent out by the school, in date order, which will hopefully help you finding exactly what you need when you need it. Many parents are aware that the start of term for catering was a little tricky, but I am pleased to report that by working closely with our caterers Holroyd Howe, and the kitchen staff, a number of changes have been made. I continue to monitor our catering very carefully and would like to reassure parents that the meals provided by the kitchen are delicious and meet all of the expected nutritional requirements. With careful planning the lunches have also been served from the lunch hall for Years Five and Six, and from Monday 12th October Year Four will also be served in the hall. Nursery have been served from hot plates in the Nursery setting, and it is pleasing that we continue to strive to ensure that as many children as possible

experience a positive lunch experience.


