#### **HEAD'S WELCOME**

Dear Parents and Children,

We have just completed our first full week at school, and what a wonderful week it has been!

The week started off with resuming the much missed year group assemblies. The focus for assemblies and PHSE this week was Gatehouse's 'Guiding Values', which you will find in the Behaviour Policy located on the website. The children were encouraged to discuss what they understood by the ideas of 'Respect', 'Accountability' and 'Concern', all of which are characteristics of the highest standards of behaviour. I do hope that some of you get an opportunity to discuss

this as a family over the weekend.

It is difficult to ignore that we have a constant battle with Covid-19 and the implications for everyone in all areas of our lives, not just education. However, please be assured that we will approach each challenge with the outstanding high standards that you expect from everyone at Gatehouse. The motto for this year is 'hope for the best, prepare for the worst', and if we adopt this motto during these difficult times there will be no surprises for what happens in between. May I ask that parents continue to support the school and each other with social distancing and wearing face masks where possible? Structures in school

are ever changing to maintain the highest possible standards of safety, and we are trustful of our parents to continue to be vigilant and responsible whilst on the school premises and outside of school.

I am sure that you are all aware of the mental strain that the past months have placed upon both adults and children. Mrs Veitch's appointment as Head of Pastoral Care was a deliberate appointment as a means to support both children and families during these stressful times. Please do contact her with any concerns that can be supported pastorally.

To update you on what is going on behind the scenes, Mrs Roper continues to work on many exciting English projects, Mr Islam is looking at expanding scientific experiments and Mr Fox is working on a Gatehouse School song amongst the many exciting projects that are bubbling away througout the school day. I have appointed a secondary school maths specialist who has been observed by the Senior Leadership Team as an outstanding teacher of mathematics. He has very high credentials and will be an amazing addition and asset to the school and the maths department. He will start at Gatehouse on 5th October, three weeks before Mrs Alghatta begins her maternity leave. He will work with Mrs Alghatta for three weeks prior to her departure, which will provide a three week handover period which ensures an informed and seamless transition from one teacher to the other.

I would like to wish our alumni the very best of luck in their new schools, and I am certain that they will work hard and make us as proud in their new schools as they did when they attended Gatehouse.

A few housekeeping points for your attention. Would you please ensure that all children bring a named water bottle to school as staying hydrated is very important. Also, where possible, would you please try to stay 2 metres apart and wear a face mask as this added level of protection helps us all.

As always, the voice of our pupils and parents is very important, therefore the staff and I look forward to good communications to ensure that Gatehouse is and continues to be the VERY BEST! At this difficult time I want to continue to keep the school and parents connected. The annual 'Meet the Teacher' event is something that parents look forward to and find very productive. This year, to ensure continued communication with you, teachers will send out a powerpoint or bullet pointed communication Friday 11.9.2020, covering all the areas that would have been shared with you at the usual Meet the Teacher meeting. This will then be followed up with a Zoom event for a **Question and Answer** 

session relating to the general year group information. This Zoom meeting will be conducted by the year group teachers collectively as one Zoom meeting, and will take place on Wednesday 16th September from 4.30pm till 5pm.

In addition to this a virtual tour of your child's classroom will be shared with parents to provide a preview of your child's classroom and learning environment. I hope that this goes some way to keeping you connected with the school and your child's learning experience at Gatehouse.

The calendar will be uploaded to the website next week as soon as it has been reviewed in line with the updated guidance which may change this weekend.

Please look out for the half-term holiday-club letter and details of the Year Six booster classes, which will be sent out next week.


#### **Uniform Sale**

The second-hand uniform sale will be taking place on Wednesday, September 16th between 6.30pm and 7pm. Please wear a mask if you are able.


