Year 3 English



Autism Awareness Week

This week the school has been celebrating Autism Awareness Week. We had a series of assemblies and class lessons explaining to children what autism is and did activities to help us understand the difficulties people on the autistic spectrum may encounter and how we can support them. We learnt that autism is a spectrum condition and that although there are a number of similarities between people with autism, they can vary a

lot. We learnt why it is important and useful to understand about differences and how they enrich our school and our lives.

Some children at Gatehouse very bravely spoke about their experiences of being a child with autism, and helped their classmates to understand some of the things they find difficult, and some of the things they might also find easy and excel at.

We want everyone to understand four things about autism that autistic people and families say are most important to them. These are that autistic people can:

- Feel anxiety about changes or unexpected events
- Be under- or over-sensitive to sound, smells, light, taste and touch (this is called sensory sensitivity)
- Face high levels of anxiety in social situations
- Have difficulties communicating

and interacting with others

Thank you to all the children who helped us this week to understand more about autism.
